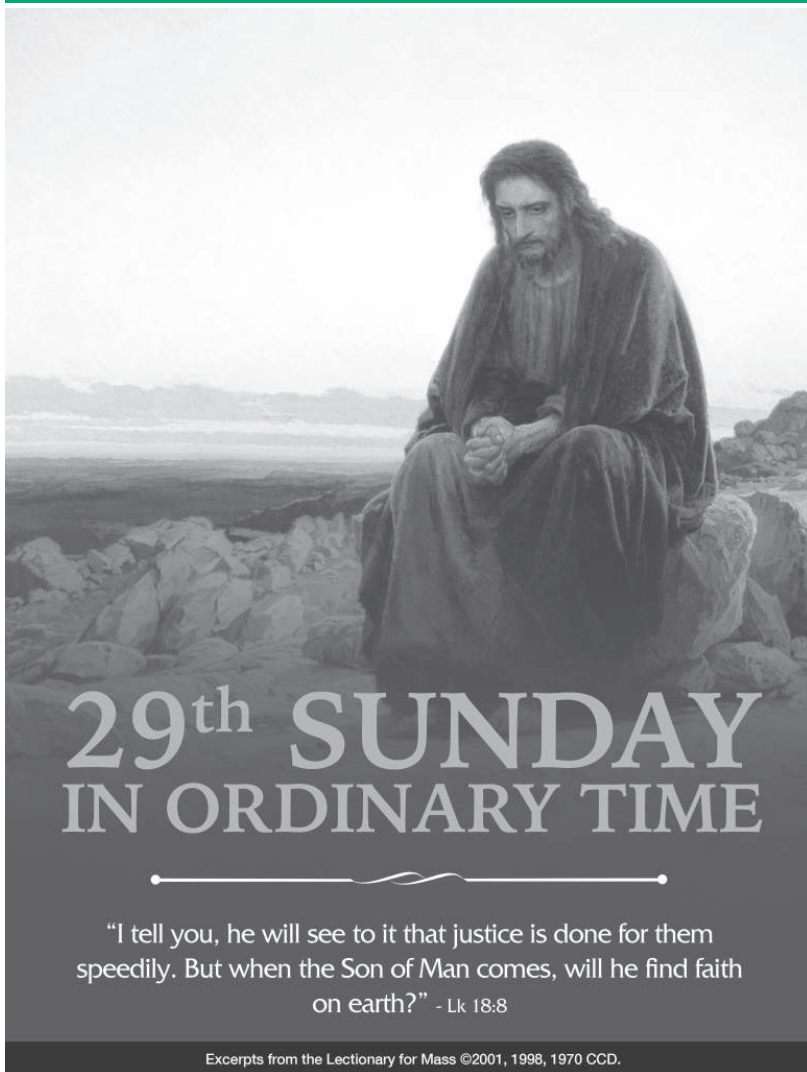

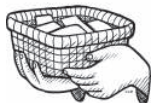

SANCTUARY RENOVATION

We are pleased to announce that the firm Deprato-Rigali has come in with a bid much below our original estimate for painting the sanctuary. They are able to complete the entire project - fabricate the high altar (Phase 1) and paint the murals and saints (Phase 2) - for slightly under \$300,000. (Recall our original estimate was over \$300,000 for Phase 2 alone.) Deprato-Rigali is an excellent company - they helped to restore St. John Cantius Church (which was recently voted the most beautiful church in the United States—and which we visited on our recent bus trip).

Our Parish has committed to Phase 1 and we have set aside \$130,000 in parish funds for the altar fabrication. We have an additional \$36,500 that has already been donated. This combined amount - \$166,500 - is over and above the cost of the altar fabrication (\$156,000, but we will get a price reduction if Deprato-Rigali gets the contract for Phase 2 as well.)

We would like to be able to commit to Phase 2. This requires about another \$135,000. We ask that people who may have been waiting to donate toward the project wait no longer.

With painting costs down, here are new figures:

- two big murals at sides of altar: \$20,000 each

- mural behind the altar (angels): \$10,000

- ten saints: \$5,500 each

Let us pray for Bl. Fra Angelico's intercession that this project may give glory to God & Our Lady!

The True Cause of Today's "Sex Mess": Contraception

I have traveled to over 60 countries in the nearly six years since I joined the HLI family. Based on feedback I've received from several dozen conferences and hundreds of parish talks I've given, I estimate that around 90% have never heard a homily on the evil of contraception -- much less a word about its abortifacient effects -- and nothing about the violent crime of abortion.

I believe the primary threat affecting the sacred institution of holy matrimony and eroding respect for human life is the evil of contraception and the mentality that follows from its acceptance. Contraception is a direct attack on God's plan for marital life. It is a cancer! Contraception rejects the dignity of human sexuality and its proper role within marital life. The silence or ambiguity from those entrusted with teaching the faithful -- accompanying them along the narrow path -- is an act of scandalous neglect and indifference towards the people of God. Worse are those who through dissent purposefully mislead the faithful into believing contraception is a viable option.

Our Lord tells us to judge things by their fruits. What do we see? An honest assessment of any population that has embraced contraception cannot ignore the undeniable consequences -- low birthrates and unhealthy family life. We have abortion, divorce, legal same-sex unions, cohabitation, family breakdown, and perverse sex education programs for children, child abuse, sex trafficking, pornography, immodesty, and promiscuity. Father Paul Marx called this the great "sex mess." Of course, these are all symptoms of a core problem -- dissent from the truth about the human person and the gift of sexuality. This cancer destroying our families will continue its destruction until we eradicate it. Any attempt to form our spiritual leaders that does not completely integrate Catholic teaching on sexual morality and holy matrimony is an exercise in futility. Our founder, Father Paul Marx, states it quite poignantly: *While we need a variety of pro-life groups hacking away at the anti-life monster, it is enormously futile and indeed grossly shortsighted to overlook the chief source of baby killing, which is contraception.*

It was not so long ago that Christians worldwide held common ground on the issue of contraception and the primary role of sexual intimacy between husband and wife. *We utter an emphatic warning against the use of unnatural means for the avoidance of conception, together with the grave dangers-physical, moral, and religious-thereby incurred, and against the evils with which the extension of such use threatens the race.* (Anglican Communion, Lambeth Conference, 1920) Yet, even as truth about matrimony and its openness to life was being proclaimed, we were already beginning to see the rise in threats. In 1916, four years after the first London Eugenics Conference, Margaret Sanger founded the Birth Control League, which later became Planned Parenthood. In 1921, Marie Stopes founded the first birth control clinic in Great Britain. Both women were the primary influences behind the wedding of eugenics and the development of contraceptive technology, which inevitably evolved into the population control movement -- a movement which, contrary to what many have said, continues its assault on the weak and marginalized to this day. The Anglican Communion's 1930 Lambeth Conference . . . rejected its own biblical theology on marriage and formulated a "new" teaching permitting the use of contraception for married couples.

Pope Pius XI on December 31, 1930 made the Catholic Church's response to this radical rejection of centuries of Christian teaching perfectly clear: *But no reason, however grave, may be put forward by which anything intrinsically against nature may become conformable to nature and morally good. Since, therefore, the conjugal act is destined primarily by nature for the begetting of children, those who in exercising it deliberately frustrate its natural power and purpose sin against nature and commit a deed, which is shameful and intrinsically vicious.* (*Casti Connubii*, n. 54)

Becoming "one flesh" implies self-giving, without reservation or exception, just as Christ withheld nothing of Himself from His bride, the Church, by dying for her on the cross. Any intentional interruption with the procreative nature of conjugal intercourse involves spouses selfishly withholding themselves from each other and from God, who is their partner in sacramental love. As Blessed Pope Paul VI explained, *"The Church...teaches that each and every marital act must of necessity retain its intrinsic relationship to the procreation of human life."* (*Humane Vitae*, n. 12) Pope Saint John Paul II reiterated Church teaching on matters of matrimony, family, and life. He was undaunted in his role as Peter, teacher, and guardian of sacred doctrine. He stated that contraception and abortion are fruits of the same tree. *"The pro-abortion culture is especially strong precisely where the Church's teaching on contraception is rejected."* (*Evangelium Vitae*, n. 13)

If we want to repair the damage and heal the infection affecting our families and societies, then we must get the family right. Get the family right and we can make real progress against the related scourges of contraception and abortion, divorce, euthanasia, and homosexuality. Get the family right and we will see our societies flourish and our Church prosper. We cannot afford to continue to ignore the cancer of contraception and the fruit it bears. Our families, children, and our future are on the line!
