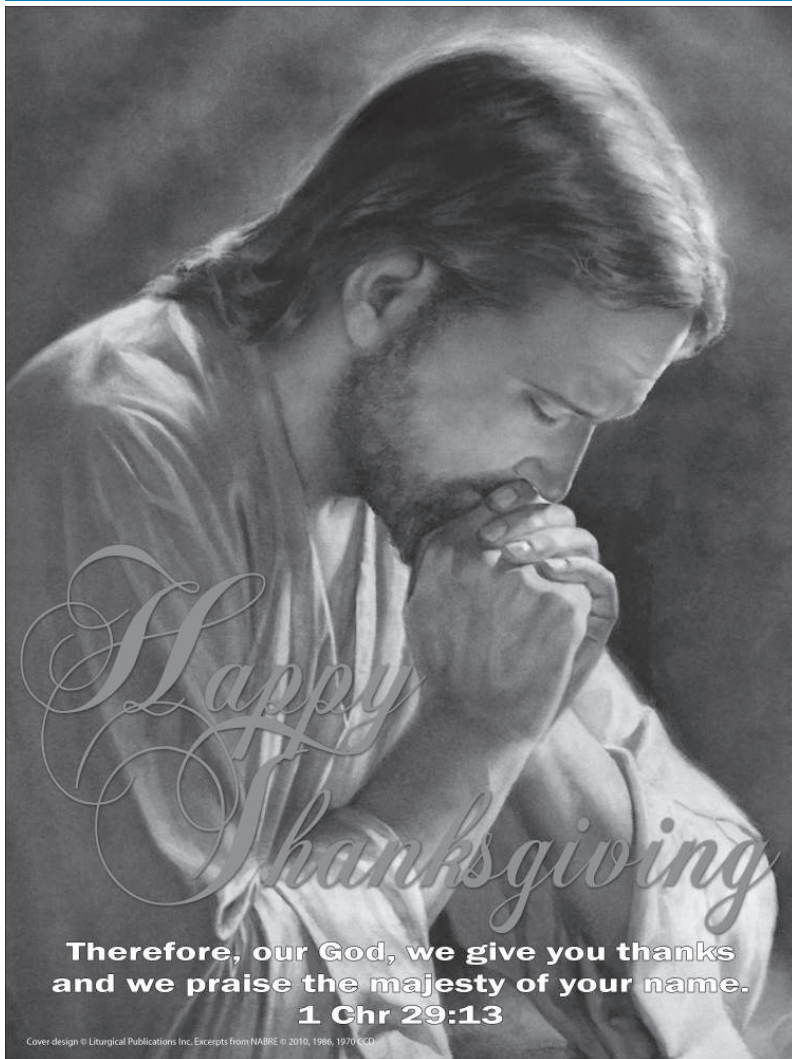

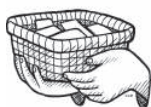

O, Lord, comfort them in their time of sorrow and grief.

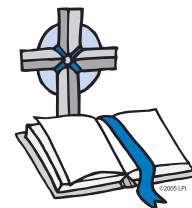

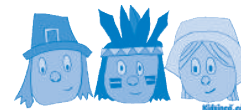

How to Avoid Being Distracted After Receiving Holy Communion by Father Jim King

After receiving Holy Communion do you find it's not uncommon for you to be distracted? For example: You return to your pew, and rather than turning to Our Lord in Prayer you find yourself watching the people in the line for Communion or those returning from receiving Communion. Or you return to your pew and begin to think not about Jesus truly present within you, but what you have planned after Mass or later in the day.

With the greatest love Jesus Christ gives us His whole Self in Holy Communion—His sacred humanity and His divinity. Yet there are times when we may find it difficult to give Him even our attention in return. What can we do when we find ourselves in this situation? Or better still, how can we avoid it?

Turn to Heaven for Help

The patron saint of priests, St. John Vianney, said, "God, the Blessed Virgin, the angels and the saints are about our path; they are at our side and see all we do." We can turn to the holy angels and saints at Communion and ask them for help. They are worshipping Jesus Christ with great love in heaven. We can ask them to worship and love the same Lord Jesus truly present in us. How could they refuse such a request? And how this changes the situation.

Now, far from being ignored by us, Jesus truly present within us is being adored by the vast multitude of the heavenly hosts. And not only this, it will move our minds and hearts to lovingly adore Jesus—for are we to be the only one among so many who is not worshipping Our Lord?

This can be more than simply a way to avoid being distracted after receiving Holy Communion. It can be a way to give greater glory and honor to Our Lord every time we receive Him in Holy Communion. For in this way we offer Our Lord not only our love, but both our love and the love of those who love Him perfectly in Heaven. A few thoughts:

- Even if for some reason we still remain unable to concentrate and pray, at least we have the consolation of knowing that we have offered to Our Lord a love far greater than our own.
- Rather than waiting until Communion time to turn to heaven for help, we can do so even before Mass begins, because the saints and angels can help us throughout Mass.
- In this practice we imitate the Church: during the Liturgy, we as a community remember the angels and saints in the Eucharistic prayer, unite our prayers to the prayers of the angels and saints at the Sanctus (Holy, holy, holy) and invoke the intercession of the angels and saints during the Confiteor ("I confess to Almighty God...")
- Because our Heavenly Father has given us the Blessed Virgin Mary to be our spiritual mother, and our guardian angel to be our helper throughout life, it is especially fitting for us to turn to them for help in worshipping God at Mass and receiving Jesus in Holy Communion.
- If you find yourself distracted at Communion by your surroundings, try closing your eyes when praying. Also, if you very frequently find yourself distracted after receiving Holy Communion it may be a sign that you need to spend more time in prayer during the week.

What Jesus Expects From Us

What does Our Lord expect from us when we receive Him in Holy Communion? Not so much feelings of love, because feelings can come and go. Rather, these are the kinds of things that Jesus is looking for from us: our gratitude, our humble adoration, our trust, a desire to be with Him and spend time with Him, and a desire to do His will, keep His commandments, and please Him.

If we persevere in the grace of God, one day we will no longer need the prayers of the saints. We will be one of them. We will no longer encounter Our Lord hidden under the veil of the sacrament. We will behold His glory face to face.

And then, on that great day, with all the angels and saints, we will enter His Kingdom rejoicing, crowned with everlasting joy.

This has enabled them to serve an average of 100 meals daily, 365 days/year through their Soup Kitchen; distribute an average of 120,000 pounds of food monthly to over 1,000 families through their Food Pantry; and provide emergency residential and nightly shelter to an average of 575 households (including over 550 adults, 200 children, and 34 veterans) annually through their Emergency Family Shelter and INN’S programs.
